Evelyn's Walks

On Monday 13th June, eleven of us met in the Village Hall car park in Chilsworthy. Knowing how popular the hall is for various classes, I contacted the Booking Clerk in advance to make sure that we wouldn't cause a problem.

We set off along School Lane & followed the footpath signs which took us across the grassy fields. It was a lovely sight to see the young lambs frolicking whilst their Mums watched us closely to ensure that we meant them no harm. The route took us through the grounds of Parnacott House which I believe has similar architectural features to the Old Rectory in Pyworthy. In all fairness, we couldn't really tell as they would have been more evident at the front rather than the rear. What we saw would probably be described as the "tradesman's entrance" but it's still grand in my view.

When we reached the lane, we turned right. It was surprisingly busy but it is a well-known shortcut between Burnards House on the A3072 (Holsworthy - Bude road) & the road between Holsworthy & Bradworthy. We continued all the way to the T-



junction which gave me the opportunity to point out a couple of Tumuli from the road. One of them is in a field on the left & the other on the right. You really wouldn't know unless you study the OS map & see that they are identified as Ugworthy Barrows. Ordinarily, I wouldn't recommend walking along such a busy road on a week day BUT it was literally only for 100m & we were VERY visible with our hi-viz vests. We popped through the hedge on the opposite side of the road & joined Holsworthy Hamlet's footpath No. 5. It's very well-marked & much more accessible since a stile was recently replaced with a gate thanks to funds from DCC through the P3 scheme. We were all most grateful to the land owner for enabling the installation of the gate to take place as we would have been reluctant to walk that way if it had involved negotiating a stile. By that stage, we were all quite tired & a stile would have been seriously challenging. The footpath brought us out on the lane by the houses known as Quarry Park in Chilsworthy. By turning right, we passed the Chapel on our left & it was only a short stroll back to our cars from there. I've just realised that this circular route of approx. 3.75 miles actually includes three PROWs & not two as I had initially thought. We took the option of deviating from the road along what is known as the BOAT (By-way Open to All Traffic). It might be a 30mph limit through Chilsworthy but even at that speed, it isn't altogether pleasant being on foot in such close proximity to vehicles. It was much more pleasant venturing alongside The Green. I know that my legs were tired by the time I got home & I have every admiration for the lady from Pyworthy who cycled to Chilsworthy & back again in order to join us on the walk!!

The next walk will be on Monday 11th July. We will be setting off from The Square in Bradworthy at 10am. You are very welcome to contact me nearer the time if you would like more information about the walk.
