# **Evelyn's Walks**

Quite often people apologise for not coming on a walk because of the weather. It's normally due to rain or wind, or both! I have to admit that I doubted whether anybody would want to join me on Monday 11th July ...... because it was incredibly HOT!!!

I was pleased to see a variety of sun hats when we met in The Square in Bradworthy as there was very little cloud to protect us from the UV rays. Val Stevens very kindly led the walk as she's a resident of Bradworthy & looks after their Public Rights of Way (PROWs) through the Parish Council. We set off north along the road but took a little detour through the park. The Millennium Garden was looking particularly pretty with the roses in flower. It's such a special feature with a decorative metal framework. There are plaques dedicated to Angela Yeo who was a leading light in creating the Millennium Garden & Steve Ham who was the builder responsible for its original construction. Around the edge is a paved area with pretty mosaic tiles that were made by the School children in year 2000. There is also an impressive



selection of play equipment for anybody who has children needing entertaining. It's well worth a visit. We left the park & rejoined the road. We took a turning on the left & then joined a footpath on the left. This field can be a bit boggy sometimes as it's close to the River Waldon but the track was really quite parched & the cattle were hiding in the shade of the hedge. Beah enjoyed a swim in the river but the rest of us opted for the wooden footbridge as the water was actually quite deep & unusually, no-one was wearing wellies. Val explained that a new Permissive Footpath has been created within the last twelve months.

The route now bears left before reaching Berridon Farm. Mr Hills, the land owner, has made a fantastic job of installing some new gates supplied by DCC through the P3 (Parish Paths Partnership) scheme. He very kindly cut a path through the grass to make the new route obvious but to be fair, the new wooden posts with way markers made it very clear. He has opted for a very nice wooden gate where we emerged onto the entrance drive of the farm. It blended in beautifully under the trees. Everyone thought that we would follow the lane straight back into the Square but Val led the way along another of Bradworthy's PROWs. It's actually a bridle way but it provided a more interesting route, especially when we met a horse & a pony. I don't know who was more surprised to see the other. It was interesting to see how damp it was underfoot but it doesn't really get the benefit of the sun due to the trees. I think we were all happy to take advantage of the shade even if we had to pick our way through on the drier bits. We joined the Holsworthy - Bradworthy road which was quite busy but it was only for a short distance as we joined a footpath on the left before we got to the Church. This brought us out very nicely by The Square so we avoided walking around the bends along the road.

I think everyone thoroughly enjoyed the walk but we were all keen to find a shady place with a cool drink by the time we got back to our cars.
